- Harappans were among the first to develop a system of uniform weights and measurements (1 Rupee = 16 Anas), which took up a huge part in modern mathematics.

- "The Priest King" of Mohenjo-daro was found wearing a patterned cloak which inspired the clothing of kings and has defined a cultural reset today.

- A number of distinct example of the culture's art including terracotta figurines play an important part in contemporary art as it shaped modern art along the way.

- India being one of the largest cotton exporters and producer traces it's history back to the IVC days when the mesopotamians imported cotton from Meluhha that was possibly the part of IVC.
